TRAIL USER UPDATE:

Please remember that designated ski trails for skiers during the season the trails are being groomed. With this year's ample snowpack, grooming may continue into May unless we have an unusually warm April. Many of the ski trails are groomed by the non-profit Nordic Ski Association of Anchorage at a cost of more than \$1 million raised via annual trail pin sales. Trail pins cost \$50-\$700, so please respect the trails and the folks who contribute to the grooming effort.

MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL

If you haven't already done so, don't forget to renew your GeocacheAlaska! Sourdough (formerly, "Premium") membership. If you pay one year at a time, your membership expired on December 31, 2011. If you set up a PayPal subscription, your membership automatically renews on the subscription payment date.

You may renew your membership via PayPal (annually or by subscription), downloading a membership form and mailing it with your payment, or at any GeocacheAlaska! hosted event. All online resources you need are located on the Join GeocacheAlaska! webpage.

Your membership dues help underwrite the baseline expenses (website hosting, post office box rental, etc.) of running an organization such as ours. Income from dues and geobling sales also helps underwrite the expense of hosting events, event prizes, and food when provided. In addition to financially supporting GeocacheAlaska!, benefits of Sourdough membership include discounts on geobling and events and voting rights for the Board of Directors. Because GeocacheAlaska! is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, your membership dues are tax deductible.

MARK YOUR CALENDAR:









February 29 is going to be a big day for geocaching worldwide and right here in Alaska. From the Groundspeak newsletter, "In the 11 years and 9 months since the first geocache was placed, there is single date on which only a small fraction of geocachers have ever logged a cache. We suspect that's because this particular date has only happened twice in geocaching history; it's February 29, also known as leap day. Given our penchant for all things that leap (frogs, gazelles, lizards, excited geocachers), we wanted to mark the third leap day in geocaching history — February 29, 2012 — by seeing how many accounts can log a cache that day. Last February 29, way back in 2008, 36,696 distinct accounts logged an "Attended" or "Found it" on a cache. Given the growth of the geocaching community since then, we think we can double that number this year. But 73,392 distinct accounts logging a cache is a lofty goal; it's the second highest number of accounts to log a cache in a single day. The current record, 78,313, was set on 10/10/10. Considering that 10/10/10 was a Sunday and February 29 will be a Wednesday, it is going to require a huge push to reach our goal."

Cachers don't want to miss logging a cache on this date because you only get to fill in the February 29 calendar date to complete the "Leave No Day Uncached" challenge once every four years. Also, Groundspeak will award a new souvenir to cachers logging a cache on this date. If you don't want to wade into the ample snow around the state to log a physical cache, you can attend an event in Anchorage, Cordova, or Soldotna.

Anchorage cachers are hosting three events. The day kicks off with "Leap Into Breakfast with GeocacheAlaska!" at 6:15 a.m. at Village Inn, transitions to the lunchtime "Leapin' for Lunch Flash Mob" at noon in the Anchorage Town Square, and wraps up in the evening with "It's a Leapin' Li1gray Birthday Flash Mob," at 6:00 p.m. at Oceanview Park in South Anchorage.

In Cordova, cachers can earn a smilie by attending the "Leap Over Hana's Glacier & Snowpocalypse @ WOW" at 6:00 p.m. and Soldotna cachers can do the same at "Kenai River Leap Frog Flash Mob" which kicks off at 6:29 p.m.

LAND ACCESS HIGHLIGHTS:

A team of local cachers including Cavyguy, FlightRiskAK, Tomanoble, and Blazingpathways have worked hard to complete the requirements for Mat-Su and Chugach State Parks geocaching permits. At this time this newsletter went to press, the permits only needed a final signature. Once that happens, the 2012 permit numbers will be posted on the GeocacheAlaska! website on the Land Manager webpage at http://geocachealaska.org/landmanagers.htm and in the GeocacheAlaska! Land Use Forums.
